## Message from Sarah Sejahtera



Hello. My name is Sarah Sejahtera and I am your school's children's wellbeing practitioner. I work for the Mental Health Support Team (in schools), an early intervention service which is part of the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS). My role is funded through the NHS. I work with children (and sometimes their parents) 1:1 to provide low intensity cognitive behavioural therapy (LI-CBT). Our aim is to get in early and support children who are feeling sad and worried by teaching them simple techniques to manage their thoughts, feeling and behaviours. We work closely with families and schools to support children. All my referrals come through the school's Mental Health Lead, Jessica Ferguson, so if you think your child may benefit from support please speak to her.

We also work in partnership with school to offer a whole school approach to positively embed wellbeing in school. An example of this is the way in which I recently worked with school to complete a mental health audit (the results will be shared with you all soon). The parents that attended the focus group for this asked to know more about the service, so in response I will have a slot once a month in the newsletter to share what I am delivering in school and to explain more about my role.
