Video Interaction Guidance (VIG)

This is a strengths based intervention. We work with parents who are struggling with their child's behaviour or feel they would like to improve their relationship with their child.

We film you and your child playing, and then edit the footage to highlight the great things you are already doing. Next we meet with you to support you to understand why this has a positive effect and encourage you to do more of it.
