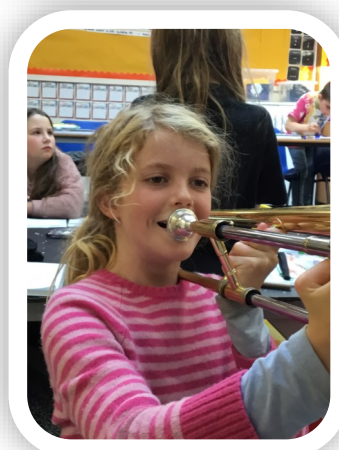
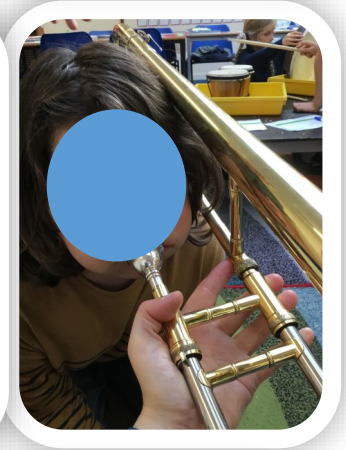
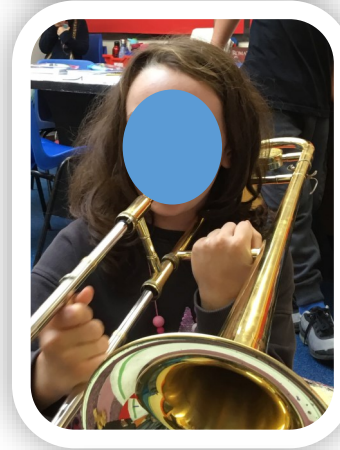


This week in Puffins...

Super Sound!

Puffins have been learning all about sound this week. They have tried lots of different activities from seeing how rice jumps on the skin of a drum to testing how different materials resonate in different ways using tuning forks. While we have been busy at Heamoor - workmen have been busy at St Levan...

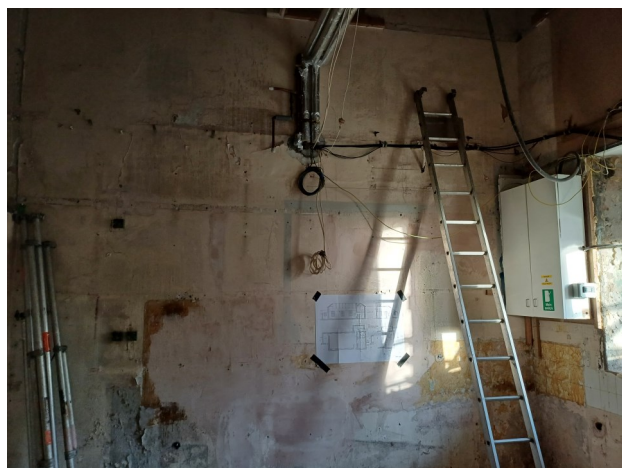
